



Destination Artwork

Between Sea and Sky



"Between Sea and Sky" is a dynamic colored glass sculpture celebrating the light and native plants of the Pacific Northwest. Visitors will discover changing colors, shadows and patterns every time they visit the atrium.

Created by nationally renowned **Artist Michele Gutlove**, this dynamic artwork will enhance the atrium, creating an intriguing gathering place and destination in the City.

The Art Piece

The suspended sculpture is made of numerous pieces of handmade glass dancing with the light. While the glass itself is transparent, its effect on the space is colorful and dynamic. Colors transform as the glass, its shadows, reflections and refractions are observed in changing light and from different angles.



The subtly changing work of art enhances the

character of atrium, transforming the lobby into an intriguing gathering place, the destination in the City.

The glass art will honor the Pacific Northwest's diverse plantings, the ocean and sky, while celebrating the gift of daylight and sunlight. By growing quartz crystals directly onto the handmade glass, it becomes dichroic glass. The crystals act as prisms and expose the component colors in the daylight and sunlight in spectacular ways.



About the Glass

Glowing orange shifts to deep red as the temperature lowers. Color and



form coalesce. Cooled to an amorphous solid, it will hold its new shape for thousands of years but always appear as a liquid. Like our planet, each piece of glass comes from a process of immense transformative heat followed by cooling. Fusing, or kiln forming, allows a deliberate and intricate layering of textures with a full spectrum palette as opaque as obsidian or as transparent as

water. Combining art and science, fused glass is the ideal material for this project.

The colors will change as they are viewed from different angles and in different lighting conditions. Bubbles trapped in the glass create glistening reflectors. The use of dichroic glass will also reflect and transmit opposite colors.

In nature, no leaves, trees, or birds are exactly the same. Similarly, each of the numerous pieces of sculptural glass will be unique in color and form, as each one will be crafted individually by hand.
